Phần 1 Giải thích ngữ pháp

Hình thức phân từ của động từ có hai loại: phân từ hiện tại (động từ nguyên thể + -ing) và phân từ quá khứ (động từ quy tắc + -ed). Phân từ hiện tại mang ý nghĩa chủ động, diễn tả hành động đang xảy ra, trong khi đó phân từ quá khứ mang ý nghĩa bị động, diễn tả hành động đã hoàn tất.

Hãy xem sự chuyển đổi giữa mệnh đề và cụm phân từ ở các ví dụ sau.

Among the people whom we like to call savages, all knowledge ***inherited by tradition*** is shared by all. (phân từ quá khứ) $\longleftrightarrow$ Among the people whom we like to call savages, all knowledge ***that is inherited by tradition*** is shared by all. (mệnh đề)

1. Chức năng ngữ pháp của phân từ

Phân từ có thể đóng vai trò của tính từ, trạng từ, bổ ngữ, v.v.

1) Phân từ được dùng làm tính từ

Phân từ có thể được dùng làm tính từ, bổ nghĩa cho danh từ.

The education **offered through private schools** will help our country progress. (Cam 3, T1, S)

2) Phân từ được dùng làm bổ ngữ

Phân từ có thể được dùng làm bổ ngữ, tương tự như chức năng của tính từ.

The minor employees remain because their job options are **limited**. (Cam 6, T3, R)

3) Phân từ được dùng làm trạng từ

Phân từ có thể được dùng làm trạng từ, diễn tả thời gian, điều kiện, cách thức, nguyên nhân, kết quả, v.v.

(1) Phân từ diễn tả thời gian

Beginning as something unusual in a handful of big cities, the new medium quickly found its way across the world. (Cam 4, G, TA, R)

When woken at other times, they reported no dreams.

(2) Phân từ diễn tả điều kiện

Guidance is good and beneficial **if done correctly**. (Cam 3, G, TA, W)

The slumber is so deep that, **if awoken**, the sleeper would be confused and disorientated. (Cam 5, G, TA, R)

(3) Phân từ diễn tả hành động bổ sung

I like Chinese food because I was brought up **eating it**. (Cam 4, T2, S)

Now many farmers have reverted to traditional farming methods, **referring to their ancestors' way to handle specific pest or disease problems**. (Cam 3, T2, W)

(4) Phân từ diễn tả cách thức

It was fired **using two rockets attached to either side of this tail**. (Cam 3, T1, R)

This medicine must be taken **as directed**. (Cam 3, G, TB, R)

(5) Phân từ diễn tả nguyên nhân

Thinking she must be late, Miss Brown decided to take a taxi.

Affected with a serious disease, he was no longer able to speak clearly.

(6) Phân từ diễn tả kết quả

Once the property values drop, the tax base will shrink, **making it necessary to cut back on needed services, further contributing to a decline in our community.** (Cam 3, G, TB, W)

Unfortunately, he has had to go into hospital for an operation, **leaving my aunt in charge of both the home and the business.** (Cam 3, G, TA, W)

As the experiment unfolded, the pupil would deliberately give the wrong answers to questions posed by the teacher, **thereby bringing on various electrical punishments.** (Cam 5, T1, R)

(7) Phân từ diễn tả mối quan hệ nhượng bộ

Trong trường hợp này, đứng trước phân từ thường là các liên từ chỉ quan hệ nhượng bộ như *though, although, v.v.*

The punchline is either a nonsense or, **though appearing silly,** has a clever second meaning. (Cam 5, T2, R)

Baekeland's invention, **although treated with disdain in its early years,** went on to enjoy an unparalleled popularity which lasted throughout the first half of the twentieth century. (Cam 5, T2, R)

In 1928 some porpoises were photographed **working like beavers to push ashore a waterlogged mattress.**

Phân từ bổ sung thông tin cho túc từ

We try hard to keep our appointments **running to time.** (Cam 6, G, TA, R)

Employees who had been putting in 12-hour days, six days a week, found their time on the job **shrinking to 10 hours daily, then, finally, to 8 hours, five days a week.** (Cam 1, T3, R)

Certainly nobody wants to see our resources **used up** and our planet **poisoned by waste.** (Cam 5, G, TB, W)

I try to get most of my work **done** during the week so I can have more free time on the weekend. (Cam 3, T4, S)

2) Dạng bị động của phân từ hiện tại

Cấu tạo cơ bản: being + V-ed, được dùng để chỉ mối quan hệ giữa phân từ hiện tại với chủ ngữ.

The fireflies are a huge group containing over 2,000 species, with new ones **being discovered all the time.** (Cam 5, G, TB, R)

The type of action needed against passive smoking should be similar to that **being taken against illegal drugs and AIDS.** (Cam 3, T1, R)

3. Cấu trúc ghép của phân từ
