Complete the review of the past tense with 'simple' or 'continuous'.

Grammar review - simple past or past continuous?

We use the _____¹ to talk about completed events in the past:

I **woke up** this morning at 8 o'clock.

Where **did** you **go** yesterday?

We use the _____² to talk about unfinished activities that are in progress at a particular time in the past:

I **was sleeping** at 7 o'clock this morning.

He **wasn't working** at 6 o'clock.

We use the **simple past** with the **past** _____³ to talk about a finished action that happened while another activity was in progress:

I **was sleeping** when you **called** me.

Were you **having** lunch when I **arrived**?

Remember that some verbs are NEVER used with the _____⁴. These are called state verbs, e.g. love, like, know, need, want, hate, understand, etc.

I **liked** her very much. (NOT ~~I was liking~~ her.)
