

The Future Tense

Explanation and Examples

✚ Future Simple (will):

Explanation: Used for spontaneous decisions, promises, offers, and predictions.

Example: "I will call you later."

✚ Going to:

Explanation: Used for plans and intentions, and predictions based on present evidence.

Example: "I'm going to start a new job next month."

✚ Present Continuous for Future:

Explanation: Used for definite plans and arrangements.

Example: "I'm meeting her at 6 PM."

✚ Future Perfect:

Explanation: Used to say something will be completed by a certain time in the future.

Example: "By next year, I will have finished my degree."
