a fine white or brown powder made from grain, especially wheat, and used in cooking for making bread, cakes, etc.

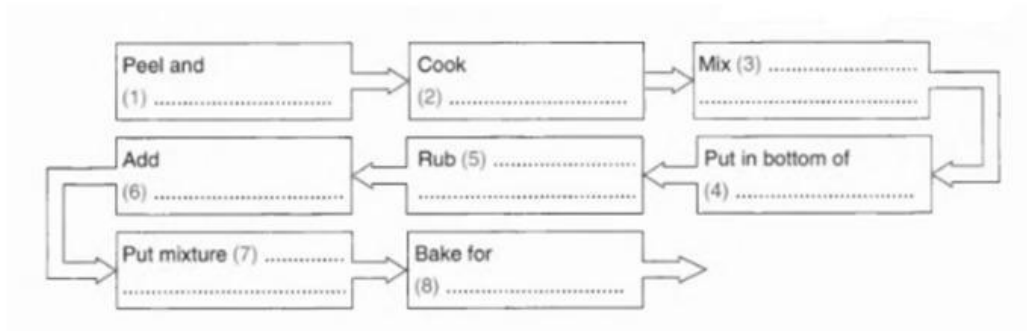
to cook food in an oven without extra fat or liquid; to be cooked in this way

Now, the next thing to do is rub the 12 , and 13 together with your 14 until it's in tiny pieces, like breadcrumbs. Then, add the sugar. When it's ready, put the crumble mixture on the top of the fruit and 15 it all in the oven for 30 minutes.
