INVENTORS

The inventors of the popular *search engine*¹, **Google** are Larry Page and Sergey Brin.

THE NAME: GOOGLE & GOOGOL

The word **Google** comes from **googol**. Googol is the name for the number 1 with a hundred zeros after it. This term first appeared in the book *Mathematics and the Imagination* by Edward Kasner and James Newman. Google's inventors thought that it was a good way to represent the immense quantity of information that a search engine needs to analyse before it finds a specific website.



THE BEGINNING

In 1995, Larry Page and Sergey Brin met at the Computer Science Department of Stanford University. In January of 1996, they started a program for a search engine and they called it **BackRub**.

AFTER THAT

BackRub received positive comments, so the inventors decided to keep working on the project. It was only later that the company became Google as we know it today. In the early days, Page and Brin worked from their shared bedroom at university, using cheap old computers due to limited funds. At one point, they tried to sell their invention, but nobody wanted it because it still needed a lot of work. So Page and Brin decided to keep Google, seek more financing, improve the product, and offer it to the public. That was a smart decision!

AND NOW

Google is the world's most famous search engine, which also offers numerous products and services, from e-mail and online document creation to software for mobile phones and tablets. The story of Google is a clear example of how an original idea can be transformed into a powerful global force in technology.

If you are SAD, see the light!

Many people feel depressed in the winter, and now scientists know why.



In the 1970s an American engineer called Herb Kern noticed that in the spring and summer he was happy and had a lot of energy, **because** / **so** / **but** ⁽¹⁾ every winter he became depressed and lazy. He thought this **is** / **was** / **were** ⁽²⁾ because there wasn't much daylight in the winter, so he asked some scientists to create a 'light box,' which is

a special lamp that produces a bright light. He put the box **at** / **in** / **on** ⁽³⁾ his desk and after a few days he **is feeling** / **feels** / **felt** ⁽⁴⁾ a lot better. In 1982, the scientists gave **his** / **their** / **its** ⁽⁵⁾ feeling of being depressed in winter a name - Seasonal Affective Disorder, or SAD.

At present in the USA, about 20% of people **have** / **has** / **had** ⁽⁶⁾ SAD, and it is common in other countries like the UK and Sweden. People get SAD in autumn and winter, when the days are shorter, and **there are** / **it is** / **there is** ⁽⁷⁾ less daylight. It is more common in women **that** / **than** / **as** ⁽⁸⁾ in men. People who suffer from SAD **ever** / **never** / **usually** ⁽⁹⁾ sleep a lot but they still feel tired all the time. They don't eat **some** / **many** / **much** ⁽¹⁰⁾ healthy food and they feel depressed. Thanks to Kern's experiment, one of the answers to SAD is bright light. New research suggests that if people with SAD use a light box for half an hour a day, they feel more motivated and energised.
