

Contrast Words: Usage and Examples

Contrast words are used to show differences between two ideas, actions, or things. They help make your writing clearer by emphasizing these differences.

1. **But:**
 - **Usage:** Connects two contrasting ideas within the same sentence.
 - **Example:** "I wanted to go for a walk, but it started raining."
2. **Although/Though:**
 - **Usage:** Introduces a contrast, often with surprising or unexpected information.
 - **Example:** "Although she was tired, she finished her homework."
3. **Unlike:**
 - **Usage:** Compares two different things or people, highlighting how they are different.
 - **Example:** "Unlike his brother, Tom is very talkative."
4. **While:**
 - **Usage:** Shows contrast between two actions or conditions happening at the same time.
 - **Example:** "I was studying while my brother was playing video games."
5. **Instead:**
 - **Usage:** Indicates a substitution or an alternative action.
 - **Example:** "I didn't go out. Instead, I stayed home and read a book."
6. **In Contrast:**
 - **Usage:** Used to introduce a difference between two ideas, often in different sentences or clauses.
 - **Example:** "The south of the country is hot and dry. In contrast, the north is cold and rainy."
