

# Song Structure

**Intro**

Tells the story of the song, usually with more lyrical content than the chorus. It sets up the themes or emotions that will be emphasized later in the chorus.

**Verse**

The main message or hook of the song. It is the most memorable part, often repeated multiple times throughout the song.

**Pre-Chorus**

Sets the tone for the song and introduces the listener to the musical theme or mood.

**Chorus**

Provides contrast to the rest of the song. It usually appears after the second or third chorus and introduces a new melody, lyrics, or musical ideas. The bridge helps to break up the repetition of verses and choruses.

**Bridge**

Concludes the song. It can be a variation of the chorus, a fade-out, or a completely different section to close the song.

**Outro**

Builds tension leading into the chorus. It can add anticipation and energy to the transition from the verse to the chorus.
