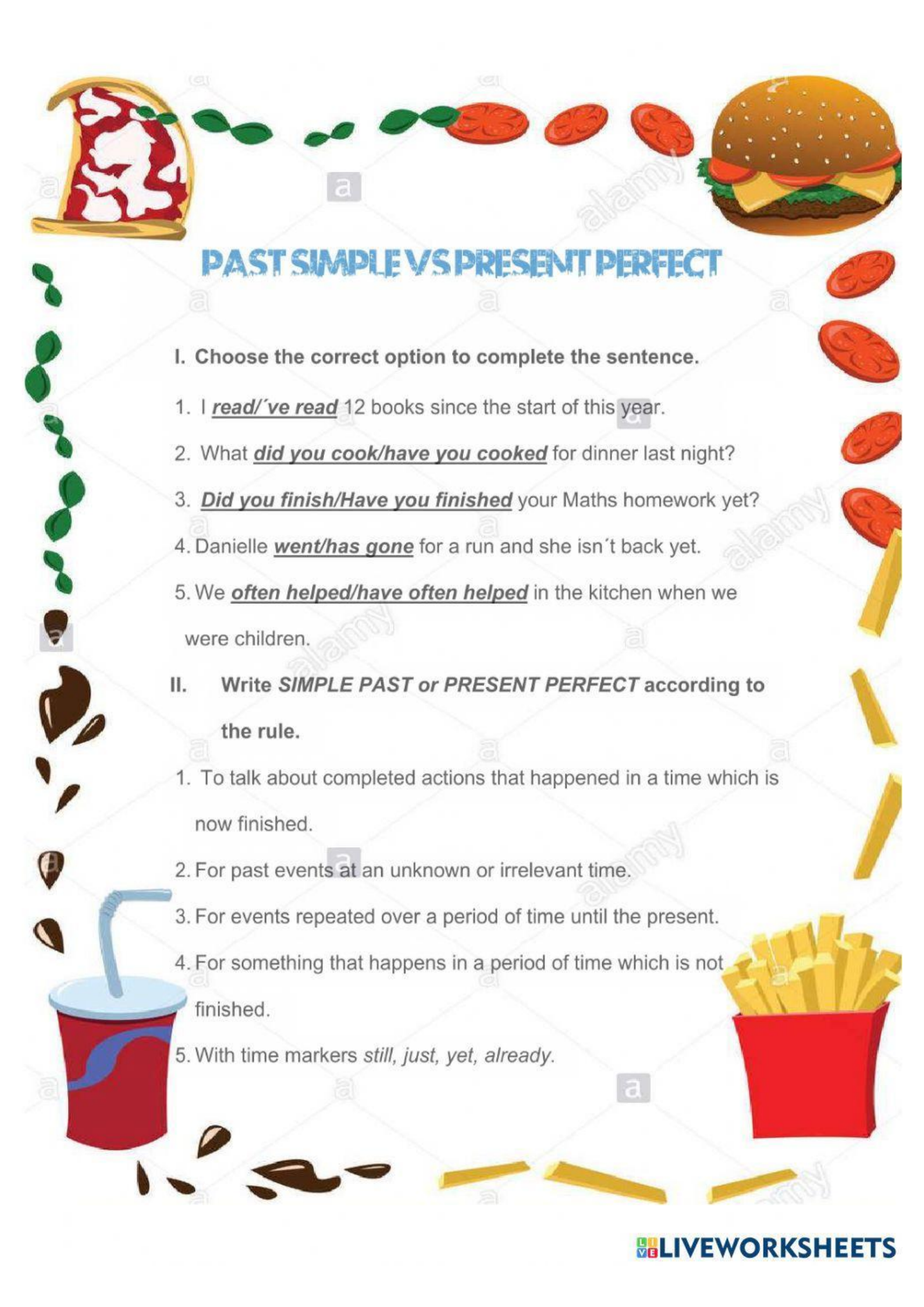




PAST SIMPLE VS PRESENT PERFECT

1. To talk about completed actions that happened in a time which is now finished.
2. For past events at an unknown or irrelevant time.
3. For events repeated over a period of time until the present.
4. For something that happens in a period of time which is not finished.
5. With time markers *still, just, yet, already*.
