Introduction to Reported Speech

Reported speech is used when we want to tell someone what another person said. Instead of quoting the exact words, we often change the tense of the verbs in the original sentence.

- **Direct Speech:** "I am working from home," she said.
- **Reported Speech:** She said (that) she was working from home.

Key changes:

- Present simple becomes past simple: "I work" -> He said he worked.
- Present continuous becomes past continuous: "I am working" -> She said she was working.
- Will becomes would: "I will work" -> He said he would work.
