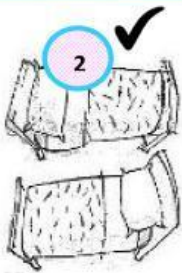
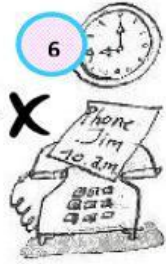


B. When used with “already” it describes an **action which happened before or sooner than expected**. It is placed between the auxiliary and the main verb.

C. When used with “yet” it describes **something that has not happened but that you expect to happen**. It is placed at the end of a negative sentence.
Ex: He hasn't met the new girl yet.

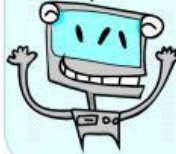
