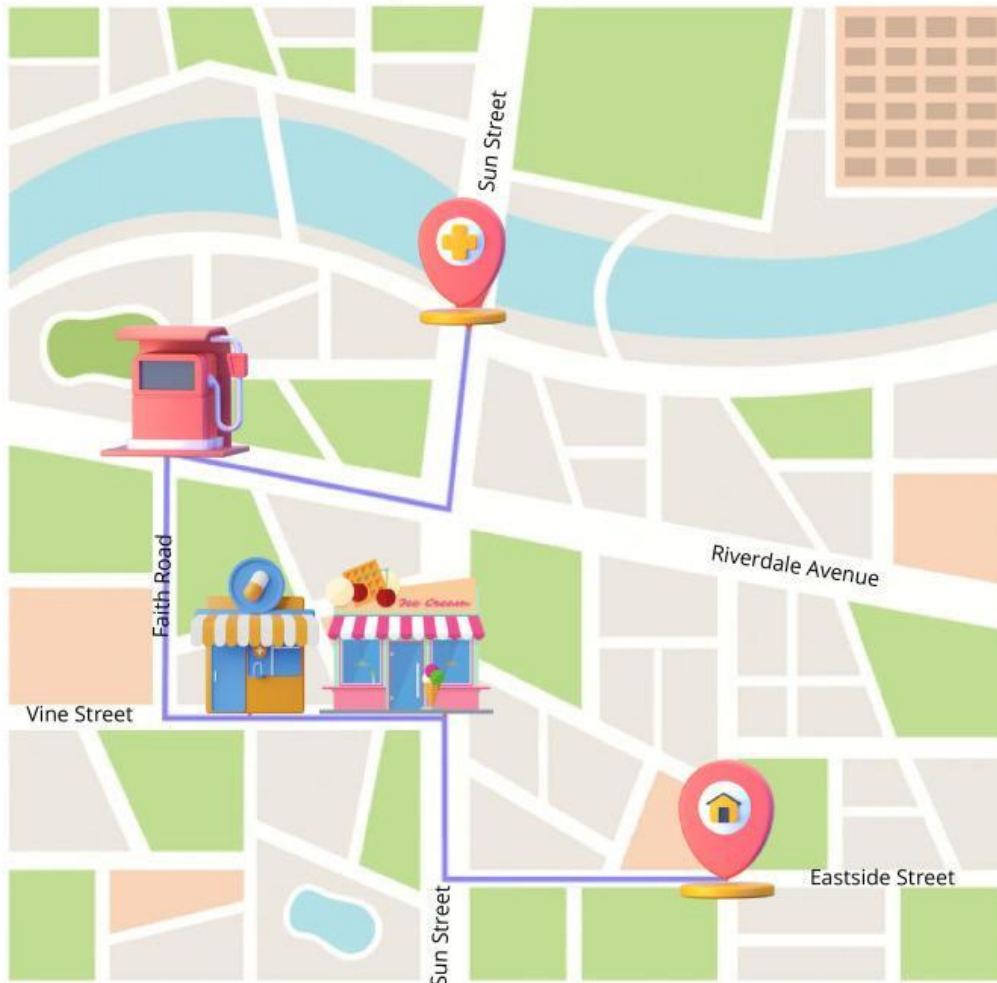




PRACTICAL ENGLISH!

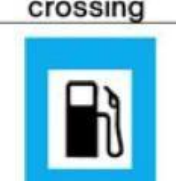
