Simple Past vs. Past Continuous

Simple Past

We use the **simple past** to talk about:

Completed actions, **habits** and **facts** in the past.



- My grandma **bought** a walking stick for my grandpa because he **twisted** his ankle on Sunday.

twist / twisted buy / bought

Past Continuous

The **past continuous** is used to express:

Interrupted actions, **specific time** as an **interruption** and **parallel** actions.

- I **was studying** in my room when my grandma called me.
- We **were playing** in the garden when Joe fell from the tree.

I - He - She - It **was** studying
We - You - they **were** studying
