POSITIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
I / You / We / They <b>have</b> played.	I / You / We / They <b>haven't</b> played.	<b>Have</b> I / you / we / they played?
He / She / It <b>has</b> played.	He / She / It <b>hasn't</b> played.	<b>Has</b> he / she / it played?
