

Using "For"

Purpose: Indicates the reason for something.

Example: "I study for my exams."

Duration: Shows how long something lasts.

Example: "I lived in Spain for two years."

Benefit: Indicates who or what benefits from an action.

Example: "This gift is for you."

Exchange: Used when referring to something given in return for something else.

Example: "I paid \$20 for this book."

Using "With"

Companionship: Indicates being together with someone.

Example: "I went to the movie with my friends."

Means or Instrument: Shows how something is done or the tool used.

Example: "She cut the paper with scissors."

Association: Indicates a relationship or connection.

Example: "I work with a great team."
