Maria and Tom are discussing potential summer travel plans. They compare three popular cities: London, New York, and Rome. Their conversation covers topics such as city size, population, weather, and hotel costs.

| Average max. daily temperature: January | 8°C | 3°C | 12°C |
| Average max. daily temperature: July | 23°C | 29°C | 30°C |
| Population | 8.5 million | 8.3 million | 2.7 million |

| Average hotel price | \$200 | \$220 | \$180 |

Maria: I'm thinking about visiting some cities next summer. Do you have any suggestions?

Tom: Hmm, what about London, New York, or Rome? They are all amazing cities!

Maria: Oh, I'd love to visit any of them! Which one is bigger?

Tom: Well, London is bigger than Rome, but New York is almost the same size as London. However, London is the biggest in terms of population.

Maria: Interesting! And which city has the hottest weather in July?

Tom: Oh, that would be Rome. It's hotter than both London and New York. In fact, Rome has an average temperature of 30°C in July, while London only has 23°C. New York is hotter than London, though—it's 29°C.

Maria: Wow, I didn't expect that. I thought London would be warmer. What about the coldest in January?

Tom: New York is the coldest in January. It can get as low as 3°C, while London is warmer, with 8°C. Rome is the warmest in January with 12°C.

Maria: And how expensive are the hotels?

Tom: Hotels in New York are the most expensive; they cost about \$220 per night. London is a bit cheaper, around \$200, and Rome is the cheapest at \$180 per night.

Maria: Sounds like Rome is not only warmer but also cheaper! Thanks for the info!
