D. WASTE

Waste becomes a resource to produce energy or alternative material. Landfills and abandoned industrial areas are gradually converted to other purposes after soil remediation. Wastewater is treated for irrigation or human consumption.

E. FOOD

Sustainability practices are mandated across the life cycle of a product, from food production to delivery and disposal.

F. MOBILITY

Travelling in the city of the future is more affordable, safe, and convenient because of automated technology and high-speed rail. Fewer personal automobiles are on the road and more pedestrian space is available.

G. CULTURE

In the densely populated and diverse city of the future, historical heritage is preserved and celebrated.

H. INFRASTRUCTURE

Buildings are constructed more efficiently and include technology that can improve the quality of natural resources such as water, soil, and air. Infrastructure is designed for pedestrian access with limited roads for cars.
