Squid Jigging

Squid jigging, locally known as 'candat sotong', is a traditional fishing activity that (0) have been around in Malaysia for many years. It is a popular activity in the East Coast states, especially in Terengganu. The squid jigging season starts (9) by March to September. The four main target squid species that anglers look for (10) is called *torak*, *cumit*, *mengabang* (11) or *katak*.

This activity requires (12) an combination of patience and skills. In traditional squid jigging, anglers (13) uses a handline and jigs tied to the string (a type of equipment for fishing). The jigs (14) am slim and come in bright colours. This is to mimic prawns, which are squids' favourite prey. According to anglers, a tug on the string indicates a catch. It is crucial to (15) reeling quickly but avoid yanking too hard. Additionally, (16) use lights is important to attract squids to the surface of the sea.
