Population Growth in the UAE

- I. The population in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) is growing very quickly, mostly because many people are moving there from other countries. Before the 1960s, the population grew slowly, but from 1960 to 1970, it went up a lot—from just under 100,000 to over 200,000 people! From 2000 to 2010, the population more than doubled, and from 2015 to 2016, it increased by 110,000, reaching just over 9.2 million.
- II. Most people living in the UAE are not Emirati. **Only 11.5 percent** are Emirati citizens. Many of the people are from **South Asia**, making up over half of the population. There are also people from Europe, America, and the Philippines. Most of these new residents are single men under 60 years old.
- III. Because there are so many men living in the UAE, there is a big difference between the number of men and women. There are many more men than women over the age of 20. This difference gets bigger in the 30 to 34 age group, where there are more than 30 percent more men than women. By the age of 65, the number of men and women is more equal, but only 1 percent of the people are over 65 years old.
