Local: You're welcome!



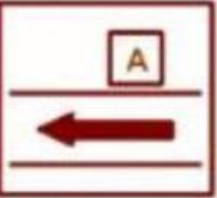
Key Vocabulary:

- **Straight ahead:** Continue going forward without turning.
- **Turn left/Turn right:** Change direction to the left or right.
- **Near/Far:** Close to or far from a location.
- **At the corner of:** Located where two streets meet.
- **Next to:** Located beside something.
- **Opposite/Across from:** Located on the other side of the street or area.
- **Between:** In the middle of two points or locations.
- **Go past:** Continue walking/driving until you pass a landmark.
- **Cross:** Go from one side of the street to the other.

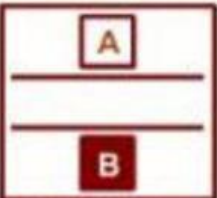
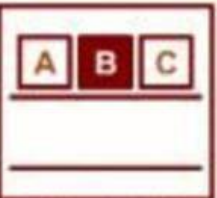
