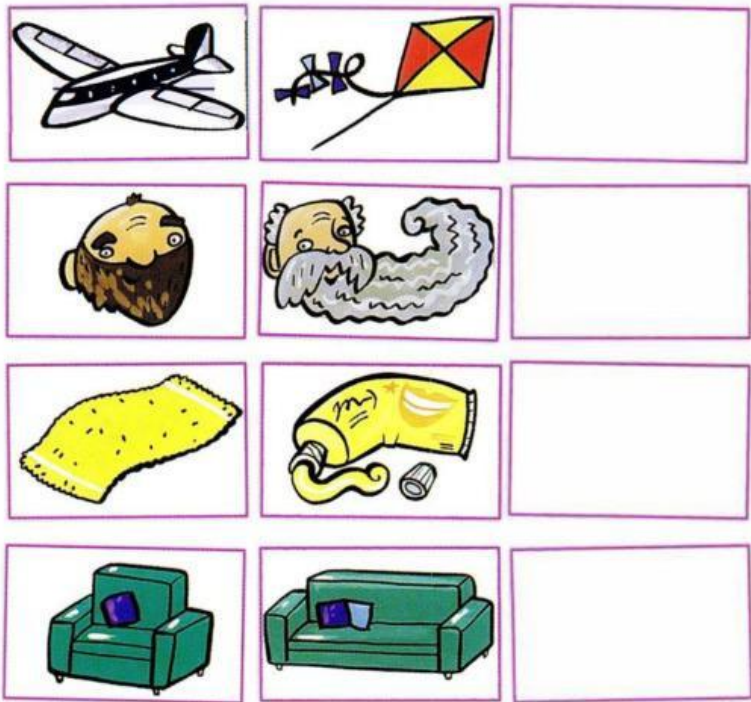


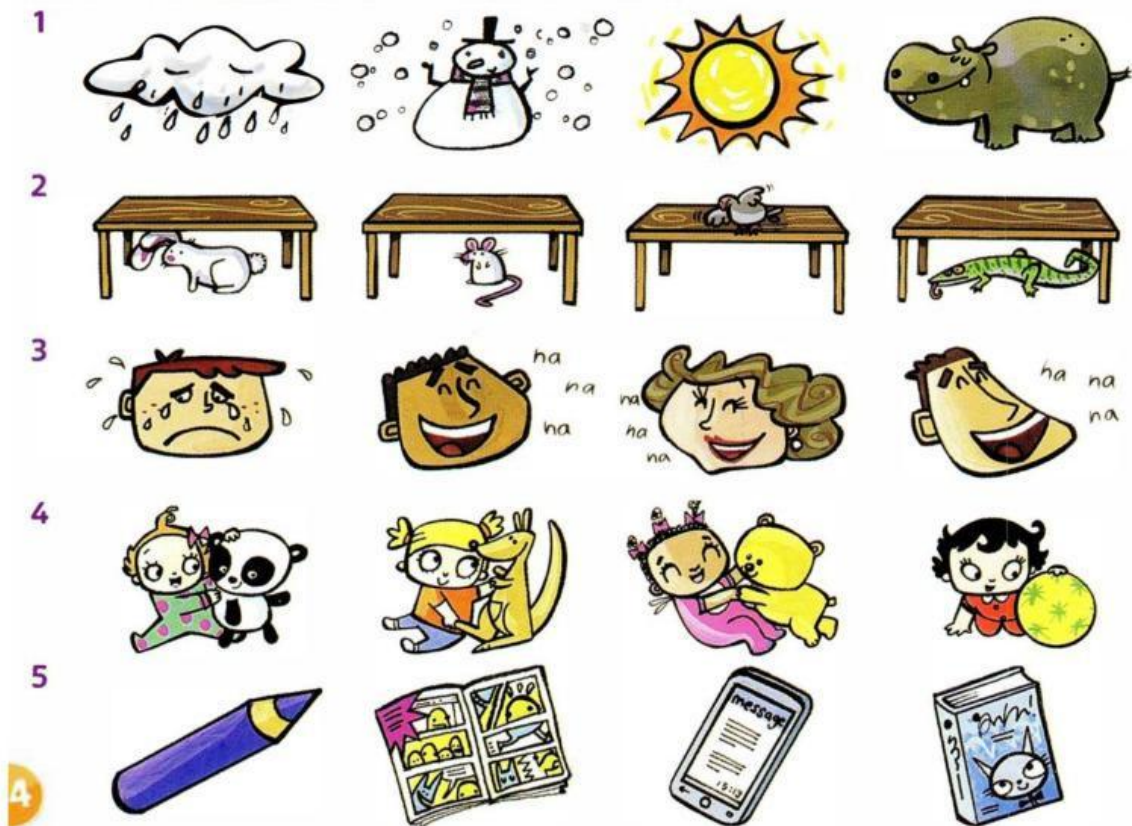

What do these words tell us about?

We often put words for colour in front of the things we're talking about.

(For example: brown hair, blue eyes)

Words like "big, little, long, short..." tell about sizes and length.

We put these words near the word they describe, and in front of words for colour.

For example: long, brown hair

 big, blue eyes

Words "nice, beautiful, ugly" is our opinion about a person or thing.

We put them further away from the thing or person we're talking about.

For example: _____, long, brown hair

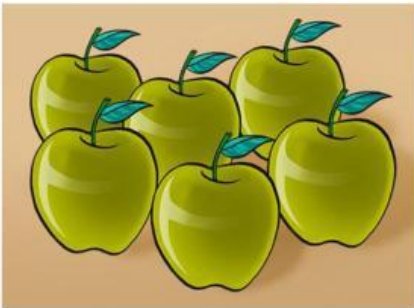
