REMEMBER!

Заплановані дії в майбутньому

To talk about things that have been planned and arranged, or are already known we use the **Present Continuous Tense**.

We are playing tennis next week.

Підмет + is/are + дія "ing"

(We have a plan to play tennis.)

We are eating at a restaurant tonight.

(We have made a plan to eat in a restaurant.)

She isn't coming next week.

(We already know that she will not arrive next week.)

Розклад транспорту, програм, подій

Note. We use the **Present Simple** to talk about timetables, programmes, scheduled events, trains, planes or buses.

Their plane leaves Heathrow at 12:35 on Sunday.

The opera begins at 19:00 on Thursday.

Our class meets from 13:00 to 14:30 on Tuesdays.

REMEMBER!

МИ НЕ ВПЕВНЕНІ, що подія відбудеться

- We use the **Future Simple** to say what you think will happen in the future.

- We use the **Future Simple** to make promises.

I'll try to come, but I won't make it by 7 pm.

I'll definitely come to your party.
