### The Simple Past Tense

<b>Topic:</b>	<i>A night at home.</i>

### 1. Getting started.

**Simple Past Tense:** It is used when an action or event has already happened before a specific point in time, and it has no connection to the present. To learn how to make proper and grammatically correct sentences in simple past tense, first we will learn how regular verbs are formed.

#### Formation of Regular Verbs:

The formation of regular verbs in the Simple Past Tense involves adding “-ed” to the base form of the verb. This is the general rule for most regular verbs in English.

Examples:

Base form of the verb (V1)	Verb in simple past tense (V2)
Play	Played
work	Worked
Clean	Cleaned
Cook	Cooked
Rent	Rented
Want	Wanted
Jump	Jumped
Talk	Talked
Help	Helped

There are some exceptions. For example, if the verb ends in a consonant + "y", the "y" is replaced by "-ied". Also, if the verb ends with the vowel "e", we simply add the consonant "d" at the end. Likewise, when a one-syllable verb ends with a single vowel followed by a single consonant, you double the final consonant before adding "-ed".

Examples:

Base form of the verb (V1)	Verb in simple past tense (V2)
Study	Studied
Try	Tried
Fly	Flied
Like	Liked
Love	Loved
Dance	Danced
Chat	Chatted
Stop	Stopped
Plan	Planned

## 2. Grammar.

Now let's look at the structure for creating sentences in the simple past.

- Structure for affirmative sentences

*Subject + verb in simple past tense + object.*

Examples:

- We watched a movie.
- He played videogames all night.
- They wanted to stay home.
- My mother cooked dinner.
- I studied for my exam last night.

- Structure for negative sentences

*Subject + did not + base form of the verb + object.*

**Examples:**

- 👉 He did not clean the house.
- 👉 We did not rent a movie.
- 👉 I did not chat with my friends last night
- 👉 They didn't play chess.
- 👉 She didn't watch TV.

**Note:** Instead of "did not", you can use "didn't". It is called contraction.
