

Phrasal Verbs with Get

Worksheet



A phrasal verb is a verb paired with one or more particles (prepositions or adverbs) that together create a meaning different from the original verb.

For example:

get + into makes "get into", which means to successfully enter a place.

Example:

"He worked hard to *get into* a prestigious university."

Let's look at more phrasal verbs that use the verb "**get**" combined with different particles to give different meanings.

Match these phrasal verbs to their definitions:

Phrasal Verb	Meaning
get along (with)	to move from place to place
get across	to start directing your efforts and attention to something
get around	to like a person and be friendly with them
get away with	to be able to deal with a difficult life situation with just enough of what you need
get down to	to communicate an idea or message successfully
get by on	to succeed in avoiding punishment for something you've done

get off	return to a place after you have been somewhere else
