Other robbers stole more money, such as the men who stole 53 million pounds from a security depot in 2006, and other robberies were more violent. Nobody died during the Great Train Robbery, and the robbers only took 2.6 million. Not only that, but the Great Train Robbery took place many years ago - on 8th August 1963, in fact.

So what happened? Well, 15 armed robbers stopped a train that was travelling from Glasgow to London by changing a green 'go' light to a red 'stop' light on the railway line. When the train stopped, the robbers got on the train and told the driver to take it to the next bridge.
