Javan Hawk-Eagle (*Elang Jawa*)

The Javan Hawk-Eagle (*Nisaetus bartelsi*) is a medium-sized, dark brown raptor in the family *Accipitridae*. It is the national bird of Indonesia and is often compared to the mythical Garuda.

The Javan Hawk Eagle is a medium-sized bird, about 60 centimeters long. It has a reddish-brown head and neck, and its body is dark brown with black stripes. A distinctive feature is its long, black crest on its head that stands almost straight up. The eagle's back and wings are dark brown, while its tail is a lighter brown with wide creamy stripes. Its throat is white with a black stripe, and its chest and belly are white with dark brown stripes. Young eagles look similar to adults but have fewer stripes and a less colorful head. Both male and female Javan Hawk Eagles look alike.

These birds are found in the humid tropical forests of Java, particularly in the eastern part of the island. They are loyal to their partners. The female usually lays one egg in a nest high on top of a forest tree. It feeds on a variety of animals, including birds, lizards, bats, and small mammals.

Unfortunately, the Javan Hawk Eagle is an endangered species. The main threats to its survival are habitat loss due to deforestation and hunting. Its population has decreased significantly. Conservation efforts are urgently needed to protect this magnificent bird and its habitat.
