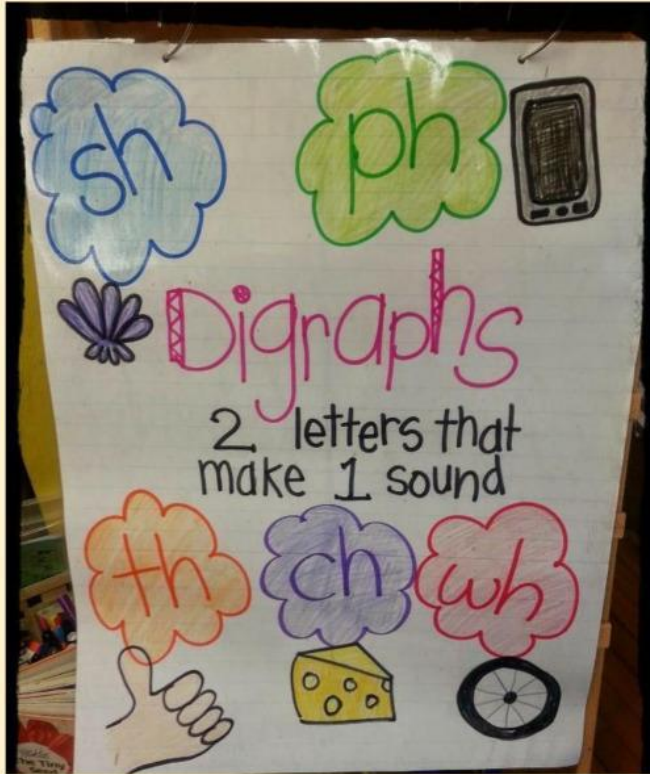

Inflectional Endings

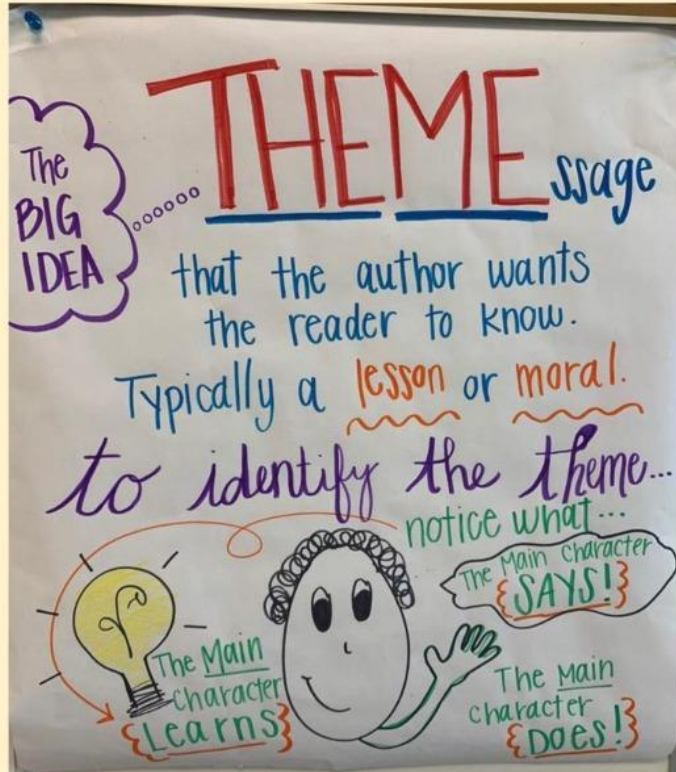
A group of letters added to the end of a word to change its meaning.

- ~ ed means an action already happened.

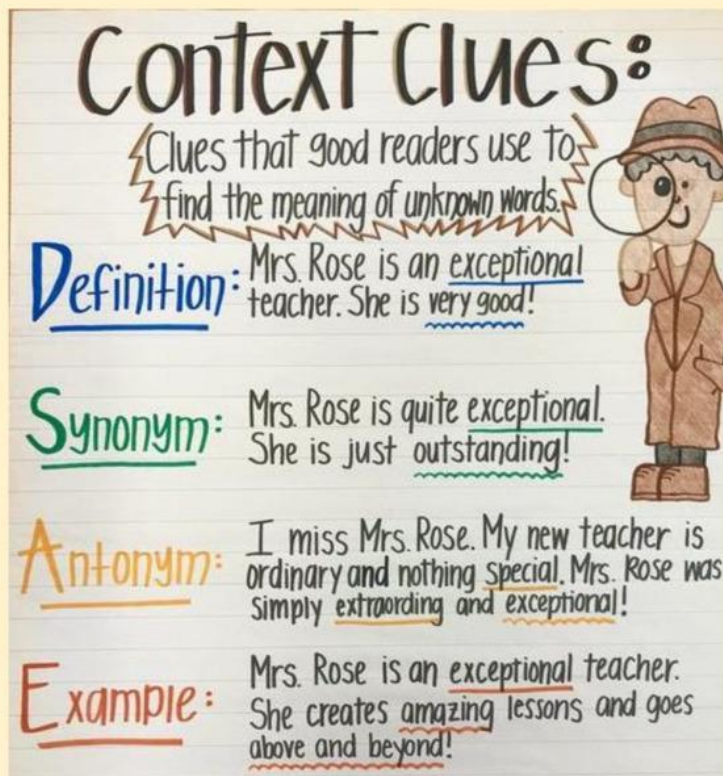

COMPARING NUMBERS

Comparing numbers means deciding if a number has more than, less than, or is the same as another number.

 less than	 greater than	 equal to
45 < 48 Forty-five is <u>less than</u> fifty-eight.	114 > 103 One hundred fourteen is <u>greater than</u> one hundred three.	79 = 79 Seventy-nine is <u>equal to</u> seventy-nine.

Start Two
If it is 10 or more, carry next digit. If it is 9 or less, not next.

Subject and Predicate

SUBJECT	Predicate
<u>Who</u> or <u>What</u> the sentence is about.	<u>What</u> the Subject does or is.
Ex: The tiger eats meat. The dog barks a lot.	Ex: Children learn new words. Dad and Mom sleep in the tent.




Common and Proper Nouns

Nouns
A noun is a person, place or thing.

Common Nouns
A person, place or thing- NOT a name!
Does not begin with a capital letter

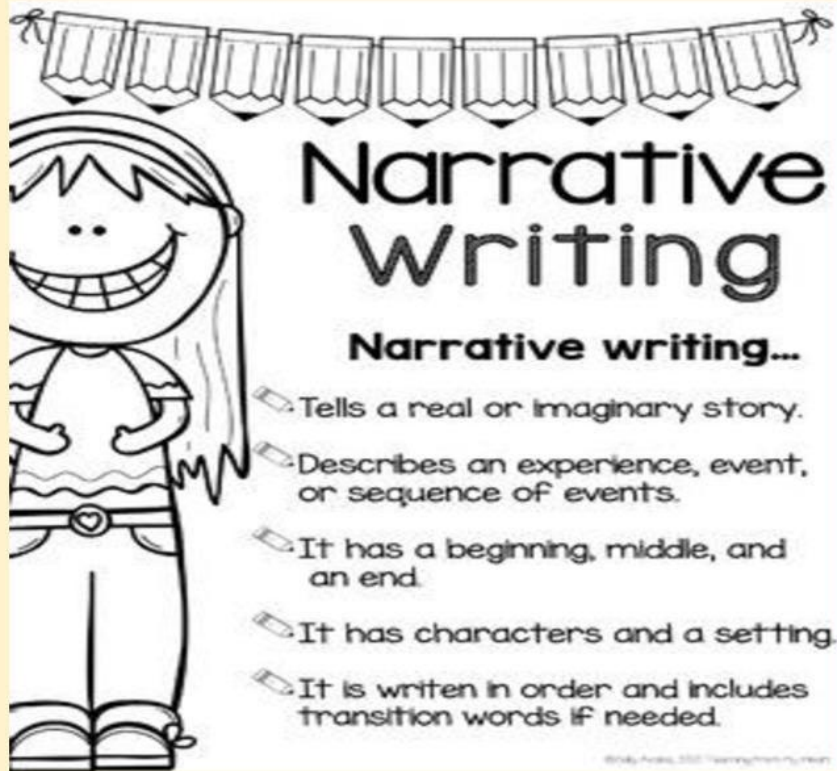
