There are travellers who plan their holidays around their favourite means of transport. They go to places with spectacular motorcycle roads, pick memorable train journeys, or fly with particular airlines to experience unique service. As for me, I choose my holiday destinations to ride funiculars. For as long as I can remember, I ¹_____ crazy about these small railways that travel up and down steep hills, pulled by a metal rope. Each funicular railway is one of a kind, with different carriages, technology used and often a fascinating, long history.

Due to the development of road transport, a lot of funiculars have stopped playing such an important role in carrying people and goods ²_____ decades ago. Today, many of them are simply great tourist attractions, like the Peak Tram in Hong Kong. Every year about seven million visitors use it to get to Victoria Peak, the highest mountain on Hong Kong Island.
