

Finland's No-Homework Schools

Finnish teachers believe in assessing students through smaller projects, presentations, and regular class activities. Teachers closely (7)_____ each student's progress, so they know where each one needs extra help or practice. This approach helps students feel less stressed, and they are able to concentrate on learning rather than worrying about test scores.

Does the "no homework" rule work? It seems so! Finnish students are consistently (8)_____ among the best in the world in reading, math, and science, even without lots of homework. Many education (9)_____ around the world are impressed by Finland's results and want to know more about how they do it.

In short, Finland's unique approach to education gives students more freedom and time for themselves after school. They believe that a happy, rested student will learn better than a stressed, tired one.
