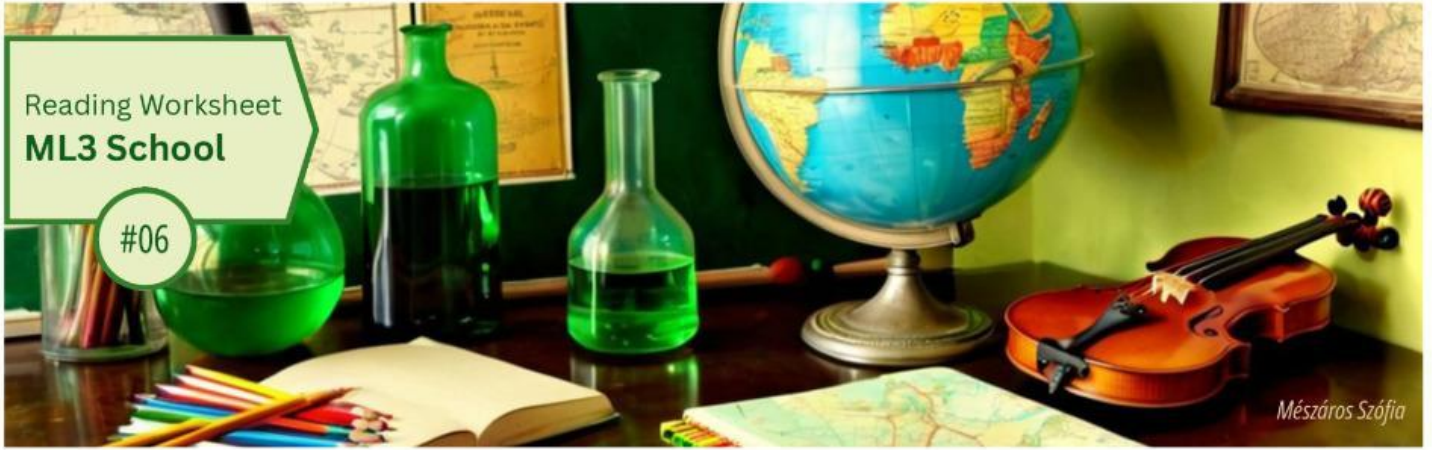




Are Some School Subjects Pointless?
