In 1997, Stephen Cowans was convicted of shooting a police officer and was locked up in jail after two fingerprint experts proved that the fingerprints, which were found at the crime scene, matched the man's. However, it turned out later that the fingerprints were made by someone else. This shows that fingerprint evidence is not always completely reliable. Fingerprint examiners, for example, can make errors and some experts are not even required to pass certification exams. Thus, in these cases, the so-called experts are incompetent and the fingerprints sometimes can be unstable evidence for proof of guilt.
