

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

We use the present continuous to talk about:

A something happening now.

Wait a minute. I'm texting my friend.

I'm not doing anything at the moment.

What are you doing right now?

B temporary situations.

Mr Evans is teaching computer class because Miss Hill is on holiday.

Tom isn't playing football today because he's ill.

What book are you reading in your English class at the moment?

C something happening in a picture/photo.

In this photo, I'm sitting next to my best friend.

- We use the:  + (am, is, are) + main verb +-ing.
- We often use the short form be: I'm, you're, he's, she's, etc.
- We often use the present continuous with these time phrases: **right now, at the moment, now, today.**
- For most verbs, we just add -ing.
 - Look: I'm looking out of the window.
 - Play: They're playing football.
- Remember the spelling rules for verbs +-ing:

most verbs	add -ing	catch – catching
verbs ending in -e	remove the final -e	take – taking
verbs ending in -ie	change -ie to -y	lie – lying
verbs ending in one vowel and one consonant	double the final consonant*	hit – hitting

*Exceptions include *open – opening, happen – happening, listen – listening* where the stress is on the first syllable.

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PRESENT CONTINUOUS

talking about now



present continuous (*be* + *-ing* verb) for:

A something happening now.

- + **They're making** a video and trying different webcams.
- One group of teenagers **isn't doing** any of those things.

? **What are you doing?**

B temporary situations.

- + At the moment, Tubers UK **are teaching** teenagers only in Exeter.
- My sister's **studying** computer science at university.
- ? **So what are they learning** at Tubers UK?

Remember the spelling changes!

get – **getting** **take** – **taking**
