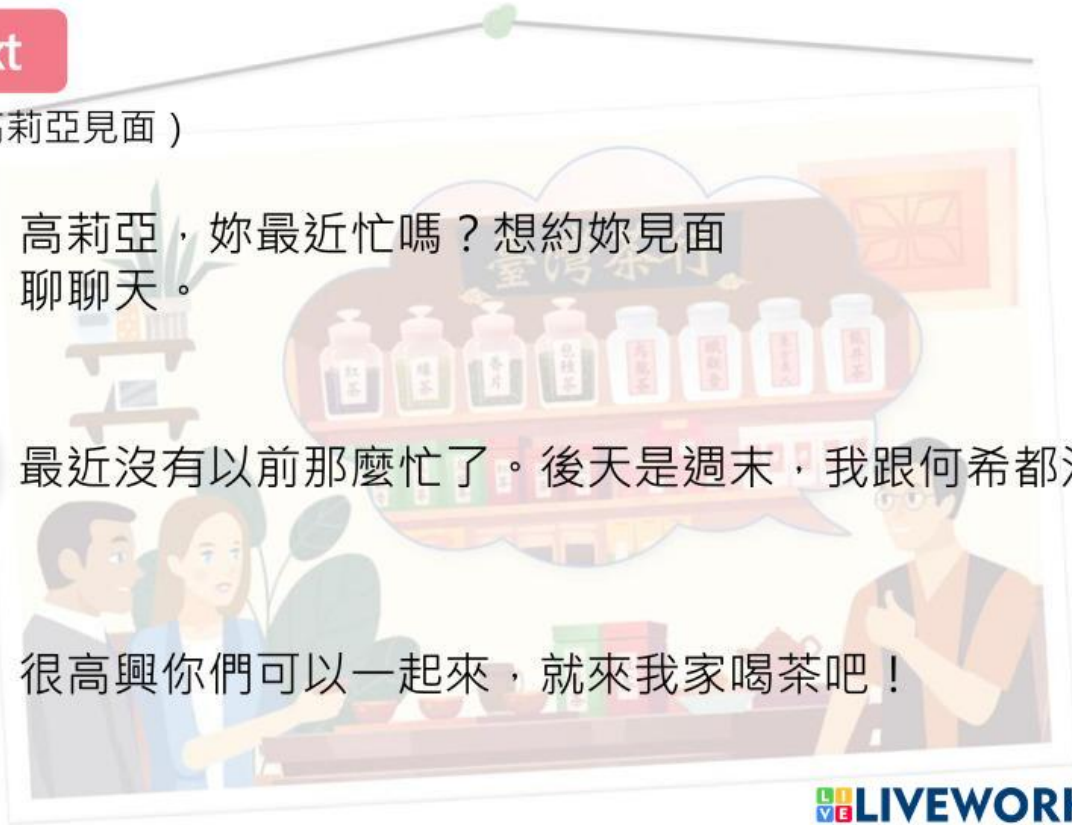
高莉亞，妳最近忙嗎？想約妳見面聊聊天。

高莉亞，何希，歡迎歡迎，請進。



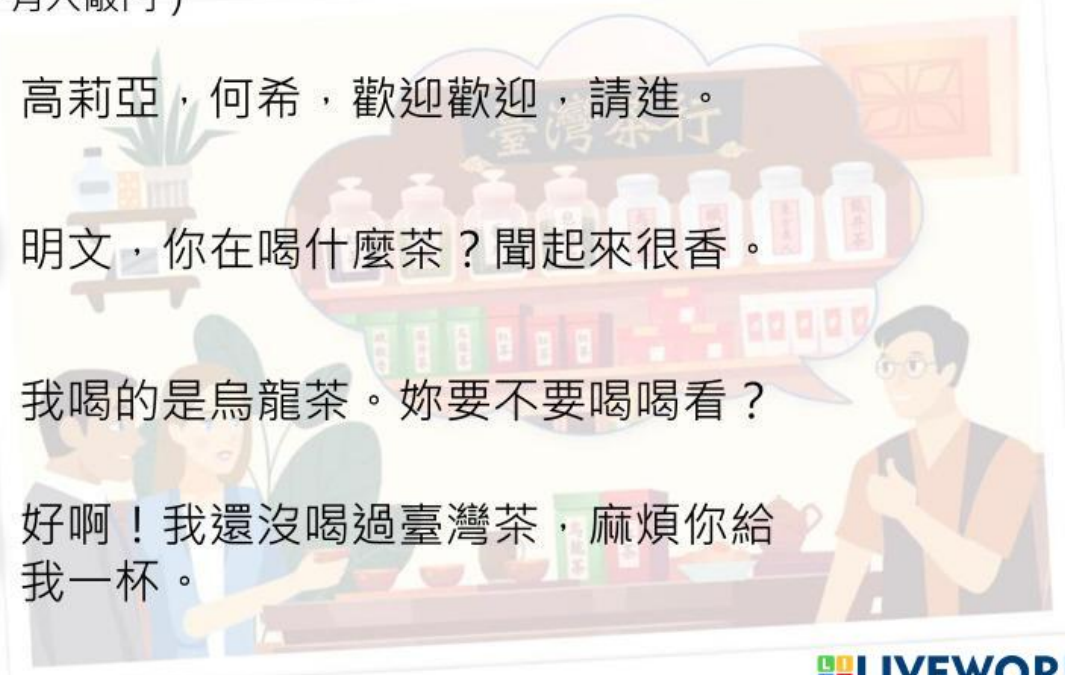
明文，你在喝什麼茶？聞起來很香。

好。泡茶需要兩分多鐘，請等一下。



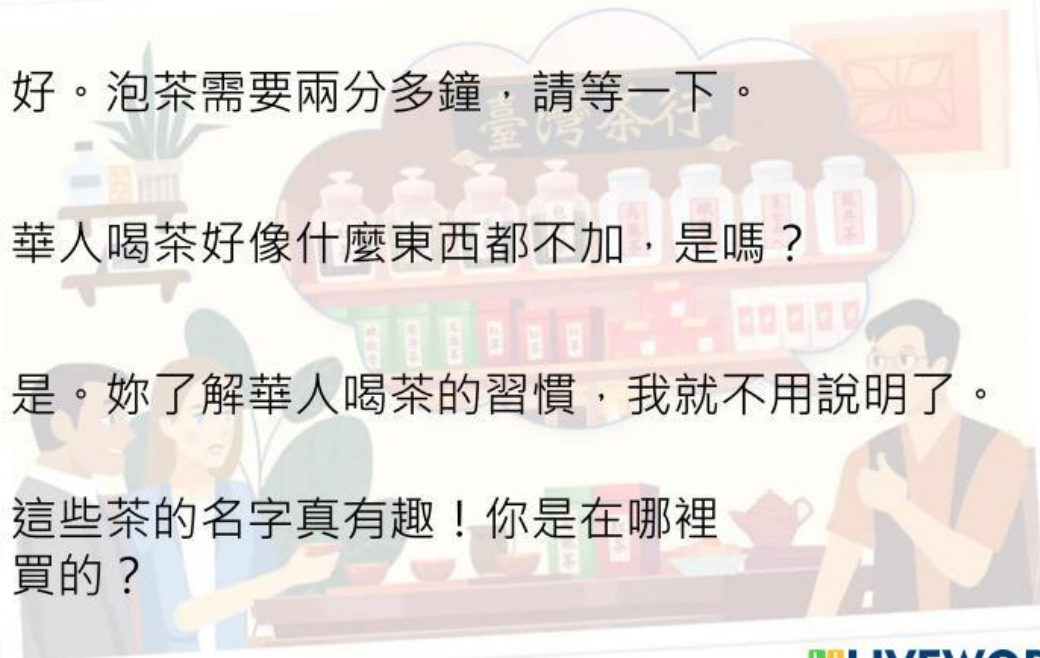
華人喝茶好像什麼東西都不加，是嗎？

A 沒有 méiyǒu B 那麼 nàme / 這麼 zhème

The sentence pattern 「A 沒有 méiyǒu B 那麼 nàme / 這麼 zhème.....」 is placed in front of an adjective to indicate that A does not measure up to B in terms of the criterion described by the adjective.

Examples:

(1) 我現在沒有以前那麼忙。

I am not as busy now as I was before.

(2) 烏龍茶沒有紅茶那麼濃。

Oolong tea is not as rich as black tea.

1. 開車沒有坐飛機那麼快。

Driving is not as fast as flying there.

2. 我知道烤火雞沒有做沙拉那麼輕鬆。

I know that roasting a turkey is not as carefree [a task] as making a salad.

3. 那裡的海邊沒有這裡的這麼漂亮。

The seashore there is not as pretty as it is here.

4. 王明文的工作經驗沒有高莉亞的那麼多。

Wang Mingwen does not have as much work experience as Gloria does.

VV 看 kàn to try

Single-syllable action verbs when reduplicated and followed by 看 kàn in spoken phrases mean “to try Ving.” Single-syllable verbs often so used include 吃 chī “eat,” 喝 hē “drink,” 做 zuò “do, make,” 聽 tīng “hear, listen,” 學 xué “learn,” 寫 xiě “write,” 穿 chuān “wear,” 逛 guàng “stroll, visit,” or 打 dǎ “hit, strike, beat,” etc.

Examples:

- (1) 這盤沙拉看起來很好吃，我想吃吃看。

This plate of salad looks delicious. I want to try [eating] it.

- (2) 這種咖啡很香，你要不要喝喝看？

This kind of coffee is very aromatic. Do you want to try [drinking] a cup?

VV 看 kàn to try

1. 果汁跟烏龍茶我都想喝喝看。

I want to try [drinking] both fruit juice and oolong tea.

2. 這件衣服的樣子很好看，你穿穿看。

This clothing is good-looking. Try wearing it.

3. 高莉亞教了我怎麼烤火雞，我要做做看。

Gloria taught me how to roast a turkey, I want to try doing it.

4. 張家安告訴我日文也有漢字，所以我打算學學看。

Joann Zhang told me Japanese also has Chinese characters, so I plan to try learning it.
