Parts of a Sentence

- ★ A sentence has two main parts: a subject and a predicate.
- ★ The **subject** is who or what the sentence is about. It can be a **noun** or a **pronoun**.
- ★ The **predicate** is what the subject is or does. It is the rest of the sentence after the subject. The predicate must have a verb.

Subject (S)	Predicate (P)
Fish	swim.
The basketball players	are tall.
Mike	is a wonderful cook.
Airplanes	fly in the sky.
The baby	wants ice cream.

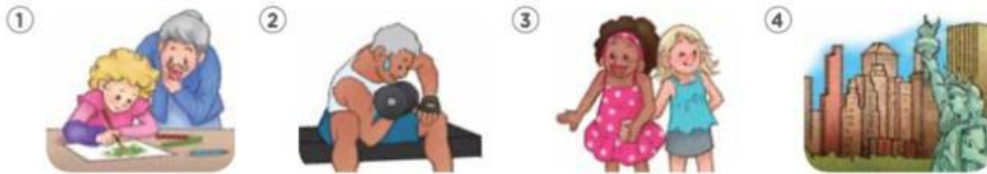
