Receptionist: Good morning. Welcome to the Early Learning Childcare Centre. How may I help you?

Caller: Hi. I spoke to you last week about my daughter for next year.

R: Oh, yes. I'll just get some from you. So, you're her mother?

C: That's right.

R: And, can I have your name?

C: It's Carol, Carol Smith.

R: And your daughter's name?

C: It's Kate.

R: Now, we have several groups at the centre and we children from three to five years old. How old is your daughter?

C: She's three now but she turns next month.

R: I'll put four down because that's how old she'll be when she starts. [1]

C: Fine, she's so her birthday and coming to the centre.

R: That's good to hear. And what's your address?

C: It's 46 Wombat Road, that's W-O-M-B-A-T [2], Woodside 4032.

R: And what's the phone number?

C: Oh... it's.....

R: So, have you decided on the days you'd like to bring your daughter here?

C: I'd prefer Monday and Wednesday

R: Hmm. I'll check, Monday's fine, but I think the centre already for Wednesday. Uhm. Yes. Sorry. It a very popular day. We can offer you a Thursday or a Friday as well.

C: Oh dear. I Thursday would [3] because she has swimming on Friday.

R: OK, got that. Because a lot of parents work, we do offer flexible start and finish times. We are open from 7:30 in the morning until 6 o'clock at night. What time would you like your daughter to start?

C: I need to get to work in the city by 9:00 so I'll at 8:30 [4]. You're pretty close to the city here so that should give me time to get there.

R: That's fine. Now, we also need to decide which group she'll be in. We have two different groups and they're divided up according to age. There's the green group, which is for three to four-year-olds. And then there's the red group which is for four- to five-year-olds.

C: She's quite for her age and she can already write her name and read a little.

R: Well, I'll put her in the red group [5] and we can always her to the green one if there are any problems.

C: That sounds fine.

R: OK. Let's to meals. We can provide breakfast, lunch and dinner. As she's

finishing pretty early, she won't need dinner, will you give her breakfast before she comes?

C: Yes, she'll only need lunch. [6]

R: Now, does she have any conditions we need to know about? Does she have asthma or any hearing problems for example?

C: No. But she does need to wear glasses. [7]

R: Oh, I'll make a note of that.

C: Yes, she's pretty good about wearing them, she can't see much without them.

R: Right. OK. Now, I also need contact details.

C: So what information do you need?

R: Just the name and number of a friend or family member we can contact in case we can't get hold of you at any time.

C: That'd better be my sister... Jenny Ball . That's B-A-double L [8]. Her phone number is 3346 7523.

R: Great. So she is the child's aunt?

C: Yes, that's right. [9]

R: I'll make a note of that as well. Now, is there anything you'd like to ask?

C: What about? How much are the fees each term?

R: Well, for two days and the hours you've chosen, that will be \$450 altogether.

C: OK, and do I have to pay that now?

R: No, we send out invoices once the children start at the centre. You can choose to pay at the end of each term or we do offer a slightly discounted rate if you pay every month.

C: Oh. I'll do that then. I find it easier to budget that way and I'm not used to the term dates just yet. [10]
