5	Chief among these reasons is that traditional values, including respect, honesty, and perseverance will still play an important role in the future.

7	Additionally, should lessons on history and literature be incorporated into school curriculum, students can learn more about their origins and develop a sense of patriotism and national pride.
8	On the other hand, I strongly disagree that modern education should completely remove traditional values for several reasons.
9	This treasured value not only strengthens family bonds but also contributes to a more ordered society.
10	For example, at some schools STEM subjects may be taught instead of humanities and arts because these skills are considered essential for future success.
11	They suppose that by teaching practical skills and knowledge, schools will prepare students to meet the demands of the 21st-century job market.
12	Similarly, teaching subjects like history and literature is seen less important than coding or data analysis.
13	While I acknowledge the important role of practical skills in modern education, I still strongly disagree with this approach.
14	For instance, older members in many Asian cultures are highly respected.
15	However, it remains a question whether employees in the 21st century can succeed in their careers with only this type of knowledge.
16	Nevertheless, I cannot support the idea of completely removing traditional values from modern education, given the aforementioned reasons.
17	In conclusion, I acknowledge that there may be some benefits of schools focusing mainly on skills that are applicable in the future.
