Everybody in town gets together and the entire town goes a little crazy on this day! Many people are dressed like monkeys, and the festival has live performances and dances.

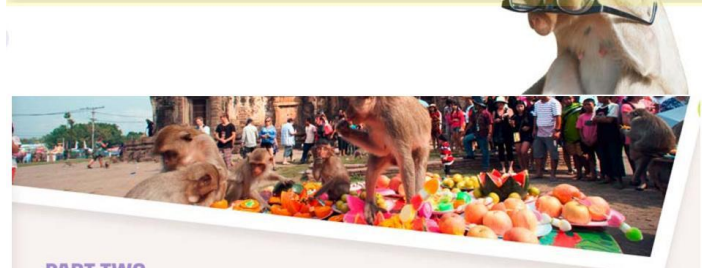
