JK. Rowling is a British author, best known as the creator of the Harry Potter series. Her real name is actually Joanne Murray Rowling.

Rowling, who had started creating fantasy stories since she was very young, found the idea for the Harry Potter series when she was on a train trip from Manchester to London in 1990. She was on a four-hour-delayed train and the idea for a story of a young boy attending a school of wizardry just simply came to her mind. She told the *Boston Globe*, "It started with Harry, then all these characters and situations came flooding into my head." When she arrived at her flat, she began to write immediately.

In June 1997, the first book, *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone* was finally published by Bloomsbury. Five months later, the book won its first award, a Nestle Smarties Book Prize. Its sequel, *Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets*, was published in July 1998. The third novel, *Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban*, was published in December 1999. The fourth book, *Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire*, was released simultaneously in the UK and the US on July 8, 2000. There was a three-year gap between the fourth and the fifth book, *Harry Potter and the Order of Phoenix*. The sixth book, *Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince*, was released on July 16, 2005. The title of the seventh and final book of Harry Potter was revealed on December 21, 2006. The title is *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows*. And it was finally released on July 21, 2007.
