Google is an incredible tool if you think about it. We have an infinite amount of information at our fingertips, and we can find exactly what we are looking for with the help of the search engine Google. Have you ever asked yourself how Google started and how it works? The story starts back in 1995, when Larry Page and Sergey Brin met at Stanford University. Together they built a search engine and called it “Backrub”. A year after it started, they changed the name to Google. Since then, it has gained popularity to become the #1 search engine in the world.

But how does Google work? Google helps you to find whatever you are looking for by you typing in just a few words. It uses a special algorithm that no one outside of the company knows. It also uses crawlers to help generate its results. It uses an additional algorithm called PageRank that gives each result Google finds a relevancy score. You can do an advanced search in which you can specify which are the most important words, from what dates you would like the webpages, and other specifications. Google has expanded to have its own email, game store, document share, translator, and more tools. It seems there is no end to Google’s success!
