



PRESENT SIMPLE

We use Present Simple to talk about habits (things we do with a certain frequency). It is usually accompanied by adverbs of time, such as **always**, **every day/week/month** **sometimes**, **often**, **once a week**, **twice a week**, **never**... Some verbs, such as *love*, *hate* or *like*, are always in the Present Simple.
