PART 1: FAMILY AND RELATIVES

How can I talk about my family members? Look at these simple examples and then, create a text about your family and relatives.

I have a **big family**. I have three sisters and one brother. My sisters' names are Maria, Sarah, and Liz. My brother's name is Jon.
I am the oldest out of all my **siblings**.
I also have 10 **cousins**.

Sometimes, correcting homework is not interesting, but I feel proud when my students say, "I've got it!" after solving a problem.
