The Battle of Ayacucho was the last confrontation of the Spanish-American wars of independence in South America (1809-1826) and meant the consolidation of the independence of the Republic of Peru. José de la Serna was a Spanish general who led of royalty army and Antonio José de Sucre was a Venezuelan general who led patriot's army.

The battle took place in the Pampa de Quinua in Ayacucho, Peru, on December 9, 1824, and the victory of the patriots meant the end of the royalty army in our land and the independence of Peru.

The treaty of peace, friendship and recognition with Peru was signed on August 14, 1879, in Paris.
