

Mixed conditionals

The ozone layer is part of the atmosphere that protects the Earth from the Sun's harmful ultraviolet (UV) light, which can cause many health problems. It is like a screen between us and the Sun. In the 1970s, scientists noticed that the ozone layer was being damaged: it was becoming thinner and there were holes above Antarctica and the Arctic. The holes were growing. If they continued growing, there could be terrible consequences for the planet. Scientists realised that the problem was being caused by the use of chemicals called CFCs. In 1989, a ban on CFCs was introduced. Luckily, by the mid-1990s, the ozone layer started to recover. It is expected to return to pre-1980s levels in around 2075.
