Tips for packing a healthy lunch box

1. Choose 1 fresh fruit. For example: grapes, apples, any berries (strawberries, blueberries, raspberries) melon or watermelon chunks or a banana.
2. Choose 2 vegetables. For example: carrot sticks, cucumber, broccoli, bell pepper strips or tomatoes.
3. Choose any healthy protein. For example: beans, nuts, seeds, peanut butter, veggie burger, roasted turkey or chicken slices, or a boiled egg.
4. Choose 1 whole grain. For example: whole grain pasta, bread, crackers, brown rice, quinoa and other minimally processed whole grains.
5. Incorporate dairy (if desired). For example: unflavoured milk, plain Greek yoghurt or small amounts of cheese. For dairy-free options, try soy milk and soy yoghurt.
