1. State the relationship between the underlined words in the following sentence, “*He swung the bat and hit a bat.*”
2. Give the figurative meaning of the following sentence, “*The exam was a piece of cake.*”
3. Give two presuppositions for the following sentence, “*I managed to win the contest.*”
4. Give the implicature for the following conversation:
Mai: *Is Nam a good boy?*
Binh: *He’s very handsome.*
5. State the relationship between the underlined words in the following sentence, “*I am clearly content with this clear content.*”
6. Give the figure of speech used in the following sentence, “*The car ran very fast and caused a serious accident.*”
7. Give two presuppositions for the following sentence, “*Why didn’t you do your homework?*”
8. Give the implicature for the following conversation:
Ann: *Can you tell me what time it is?*
John: *I never use a watch.*
9. If we are talking about a situation in which John is standing alone in the corner, does the word “John” refer to the same referent as *the person in the corner*?
10. Indicate the relationships between the following pair of words: *tool* and *saw*.
11. Imagine two different everyday situations in which separate couples are having separate conversations about what they refer to with the phrase *the Morning Star*. Would they be talking about the same object (i.e. does the *Morning Star* normally have constant reference)?
12. Write the entailment for the following sentence, “*He stole something.*”
13. Explain the semantic ambiguity in the following sentence by giving two sentences with similar meanings to the original sentence, but different ones from each other, “*Lan gave her dog food.*” (Note: Use active voice only.)
14. In the following situation, what indirect illocutionary act is carried out by the utterance:
A teacher of English says to one of his intermediate-level student in a speaking class, “*Can you speak English?*”
15. State if the following statement is true or false, “*Every expression which has meaning has sense, but not every expression has reference.*”
