An **apprenticeship** is a program where you learn a trade or profession by working and studying at the same time. It is common in fields like carpentry, (2)....., mechanics, and even healthcare. Apprenticeships usually last from one to four years, depending on the field. They often lead to a qualification or certificate that shows you are ready to work independently.



An **internship** is a short-term opportunity to gain experience in a specific job or industry. Interns often work in offices, labs, or other (6)..... to learn how things operate. Unlike apprenticeships, internships are usually focused on learning rather than earning a qualification.

For example, if you are studying marketing at (7)....., you can get an internship at a marketing agency during your summer break. You can help design social media posts, attend team meetings, and learn how to plan advertising campaigns. This experience helps you decide if marketing is the right career for you.

Internships typically last a few weeks to a few months. Some are paid, but others are unpaid. Either way, they are a valuable way to explore your career options.
