

Global Connections: International Basics

Did you know there are groups of countries working together to solve big problems? These are called international organizations. They deal with everything from (1)..... the planet to keeping peace. Let's explore some of the most important ones and what they do.

The United Nations (UN)

The UN is like the world's biggest team project. Almost every country is a (2).....! Its job is to promote peace, protect human rights, and help in emergencies like earthquakes or wars. One of its agencies, **UNICEF**, helps children worldwide, while another, **WHO** (World Health Organization), focuses on global health.

The European Union (EU)

The EU is a group of 27 European countries working together. They share laws, trade rules, and even a (3)..... – the *euro* (used by 20 of the member countries). This makes traveling and trading between these countries much easier. For example, if you visit France from Germany, you won't even need to show your (4).....!

The African Union (AU)

The AU is an organization made up of 55 African countries. Its goal is to promote unity, solve conflicts, and boost development across the continent. It also focuses on protecting human rights and fighting poverty.

NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization)

NATO is a military (5)..... between countries in North America and Europe. Its main idea? "If you attack one of us, you attack all of us." Members work together to keep each other safe.

The World Bank and IMF

These two organizations focus on money and development. The **World Bank** helps poor countries build schools, hospitals, and roads. The **IMF** (International Monetary Fund) helps countries in financial trouble. Think of it like a bank for (6).....!

The Red Cross

The Red Cross is an international organization that helps people during (7)....., like floods or wars. Its volunteers provide food, medical aid, and shelter to those in need.

Greenpeace

Greenpeace is an environmental group. It doesn't belong to any government but works internationally to protect the planet. It focuses on saving forests, (8)....., and endangered species.

International organizations are like bridges connecting countries. They solve problems no single country can (9)..... alone, like climate change or global pandemics. They also promote cooperation, which helps the world stay peaceful (or at least try to!).
