## What is a PRONOUN?

It's a word used in place of a noun.

| Subject | Object | Possessive adjective |
|---------|--------|----------------------|
| I       | ME     | MY                   |
| YOU     | YOU    | YOUR                 |
| HE      | HIM    | HIS                  |
| SHE     | HER    | HER                  |
| IT      | IT     | ITS                  |
| WE      | US     | OUR                  |
| YOU     | YOU    | YOUR                 |
| THEY    | THEM   | THEIR                |

## What time is it?

### AM vs. PM

We don't normally use the 24-hour clock in English.

We use a.m. for the morning and p.m. for the afternoon and night.

**3a.m. = Three o'clock in the morning.**

**3p.m. = Three o'clock in the afternoon.**

### O'CLOCK

o'clock (abbreviation: of the clock) only on the hour.

**What time is it?  
It's 7 o'clock.**

### IT'S

Use IT'S to answer a question that asks for the time.

**What is the time?  
It's two thirty.**

### AT

Use at when giving the time of a specific event.

**What time is your class?  
It's at seven thirty.**
