The mysterious man from Taured



This is the curious story of a man who arrived at Haneda Airport, Tokyo, in July 1954. According to most sources, the man was European-looking, had a beard, spoke French fluently and was carrying currency from a number of European countries. However, when he produced his passport, it said he was from a country called 'Taured' – a country which didn't exist.
