- 1 — We prepare the orders and deliver them to our supermarkets in each region. We have fifteen regional centres in the country. The supermarkets send their orders via the online platform. We don't have **much** time to prepare **an** order. Our delivery trucks leave here the next day with the order.
- 2 — We have over 400 warehouse workers and about fifty drivers here. It's **a** big centre. We deliver food to supermarkets in the London area and operate twenty-four hours a day.
- 3 — We have over 2,000 products including **some** fresh fruit and vegetables, drinks, tinned food, rice, pasta, cereals and cleaning products. We sell **a lot of** bananas. It's the top-selling product.
- 4 — It depends on the size and location of the store. For example, **a lot of** office workers and tourists use the small city-centre shops. **A** customer usually wants **a** sandwich or **some** sushi for lunch, or **some** snacks and water. **Not many** customers buy fresh fish and meat.

Nouns can be countable or uncountable.

Countable nouns

Countable nouns have singular and plural forms:

Singular: **a** customer, **one** customer

Plural: **some** customers, **two** customers, **twenty** customers

We use the quantifiers (**a/an**, **some**, **any**, **many**, **a lot of**) with countable nouns.

some = an amount, large or small

many/a lot of = a large amount

They have plural forms: **some** time, **some** money, **some** food. This means we cannot count them.

We use the quantifiers (**some**, **any**, **much**, **a lot of**) with uncountable nouns.

much = a large amount
