Amphibians are special animals that can live both on land and in water. They include frogs, toads, salamanders, and more. Amphibians have soft, moist skin and usually lay their (1)..... in water. Let's meet some of the most fascinating ones!

The **axolotl** is one of the most famous amphibians. It's also (2)..... the "*Mexican walking fish*," but it's not a fish – it's a type of salamander. Axolotls are amazing because they never grow up like other salamanders. They stay in their "baby" form for their entire (3).....! They have feathery gills on the sides of their heads, which look like little pink flowers. Axolotls can even regrow body parts like legs or their tail if they get hurt. This makes them one of nature's true wonders!

Another fascinating amphibian is the **glass frog**. These frogs live in the rainforests of Central and South America. Their skin is so clear that you can see their (4)..... and other organs! This helps them (5)..... from predators because they blend in with leaves.

The **red-eyed tree frog** is one of the most colorful amphibians. It has bright green (6)....., orange feet, and large red eyes. These frogs live in trees and use their sticky toes to climb. If a predator gets too (7)....., the frog flashes its bright colors to scare it away.

The **giant salamander** is the (8)..... amphibian in the world. It can grow up to 1.8 meters (6 feet) long! These huge creatures live in rivers in China and Japan. Despite their size, they are very (9)..... and spend most of their time hiding under rocks.

The **surinam toad** is a strange amphibian found in South America. It lays its eggs in the skin on its back. The eggs stay there until they hatch, and tiny baby toads come out!
